

Noosa MP Community Survey 2024 Results


This document is a summary of results provided by respondents in our end of year 2024 Noosa MP Survey.


A total of 527 responses from throughout the electorate were recorded for the 2024/25 Noosa MP survey, with 21 responses invalid for the purpose of this survey, as they were from residents of other State Electorates. A significant 67% increase on last year's participation rates!


Thank you to all that took the time to complete this survey, it has been extremely valuable in identifying your greatest local concerns, as well your thoughts on issues across Queensland.






















Top 3 local-specific State Government issues:







While 11.1% raised other issues, 3.2% suggested increased taxes, rules and/or rent controls on investment property. 2% suggested reducing or stopping Short Term Accommodation. The remainder were providing further commentary to the above issues. There was no additional singular issue raised by more than 2% of question respondents.




Of the 29.8% that stated Other most were providing further information about the above topics, primarily about decreasing speed limits. 3.3% highlighted Beckman's Road (which is not a State Government Road) as needing improvement/bypass. There was no additional singular issue raised by more than 2% of question respondents.




Of the 25.7% of respondents who indicated other, most were supplying additional information about bike, rail and bus. 4.4% of respondents indicated better parking options eg park and ride. There was no other singular issue that was raised by more than 2% of question respondents.




While 10.2% of respondents indicated Other, the majority were providing more information on the above topics and there was no singular issue that was raised by more than 2% of question respondents.




Of the 32.2% indicating speed was an issue this was predominately requiring a wider area for 6k / lower speeds (7.6%), banning or reducing speed for jetskis (3%) and more policing (3.8%). While 22% indicated Other, the majority were providing further comment on priorities listed already (particularly speeding).




While 12.3% of respondents indicated Other, the majority were providing further comment on above issues. 2% indicated parking was inadequate and there was no other singular issue that was raised by more than 2% of question respondents.




While 9.6% of respondents indicated Other, they were providing further comment on priorities listed already and there was no singular issue that was raised by more than 2% of question respondents.




7.1% indicated other but they were providing additional comment on above topics.




Of the 9.4% of respondents indicating Other, the majority were providing further comment on priorities listed already. 2.4% indicated e-bikes were an issue. There was no additional singular issue that was raised by more than 2% of question respondents.
